OPSH kills 7 suspected criminals, recovers sophisticated rifles in Plateau

EVEN suspected criminals terrorising the residents of Jos, Plateau State, have been gunned down by Operation Safe Haven (OPSH), which is in charge of security in Plateau and some parts of Bauchi State, while sophisticated locally-made, imported guns and other weapons were also recovered.

The security outfit's Commander, Major General Nicholas Rogers, who stated this shortly after the criminals were paraded at the headquarters of the command in Jos, said the suspects had been on the watch list for some time, adding that 11 of them were arrested during the gun duel with men of his command.

According to him, the 11 suspects had been terrorising the inhabitants of Jos and some parts of the Southern Kaduna where the men of his command carried out special operation to restore sanity to the troubled area.

He stated that the suspects were in possession of assorted guns and locallyfabricated rifles, communication gadgets and uniforms belonging to the military, boys' brigade and other para-military outfits. El M
