## Mob kills soldier after he hit hawker with *okada* in Nasarawa

NASARAWA State Police Command has arrested two persons in connection with a mob action that led to the death of a soldier, Lance Corporal Ayuba Ali, on Monday, in Akwanga area of the state.

vestigation had begun to arrest all the perpetrators of the dastardly act.

Meanwhile, Mr John Abimiku, an eyewitness told *NAN* that the area had been deserted for fear of the unknown.

"As I speak with you now, about four military

trucks are stationed in the area and soldiers are picking up any youth on sight, "Abimiku added.

AN Ibadan-based legal practitioner, Mr Tunde Ojehomon, has petitioned the Lagos State Police Command over the arrest, detention and prejudicial stigmatisation, harassment and wrongfully accusing his client, Alhaji Abayomi Alaka for having a link with a group otherwise known as Badoo.
