The Police Public Relations Officer in the state, Moses Yamu, who confirmed the recent killings to the Nigerian Tribune in Makurdi, said that a clash in the area resulted in the death of three persons on Saturday night while another person was injured and later died on Sunday morning

According to the command spokesman, "yes there was a clash that claimed the lives of three persons on Saturday night and another injured person gave up today, making four deaths in all. Normalcy has been restored as more patrol teams have been reinforced to the area to support the ones that were there after the August mayhem in that area."

He disclosed that police were yet to establish the motive for the killings but said it might not be unconnected with the incident that happened last August.

"It is likely that Saturday's

clash and killing is connected to what happened in the area recently but we have commenced full investigations to bring the killers to book," the PPRO stated.

He urged the public to provide security agencies with useful information that could lead to the arrest of the killers.
