Fire kills triplets, brother in Jigav

fire outbreak has killed triplets and their brother in Hadejia town, Jigawa, according to the spokesman of the Nigeria Security and Civil Defence Corps in the state, Mr Adamu Shehu.

Shehu told the News of Agency Nigeria (NAN) on Monday that the fire was caused by a spark from an electric appliance.

He gave the names of the triplets as Hassan Sale, Hussain Sale and Muhusin Sale, and their elder brother, Aliyu Sale, all of the same family.

He said the incident oc-

curred on January 20 at Tudun Tanda quarters in about 10:45 p.m.

"On January 20, at about 10:45 p.m, there was a fire disaster at the residence of one Alhaji Sale Tela of Hadejia town.

"The fire caused the death of triplets and their younger brother namely: Hassan Sale, Hussaini Sale, Muhsin Sale aged 5 and Aliyu Sale aged 2.

"It also consumed property worth of thousands of Naira.

"The causative agent we suspect is an electric spark from a water boiler," the

spokesman said.

He advised the public to ercise caution while hand electrical appliances, pa ularly during the Harma so as forestall fire outbrea

Customs intercept 55,000 litres of fuel at borders

THE Seme Border Command of the Nigeria Customs Service (NCS) has said that it has intercepted a total of 55,000 litres of Premium Motor Spirit (PMS), popularly known as petrol. smuggled in 2,200 pieces of 25-litre jerry cans, between

December 1, 2017 till date, at Pashi-Yekeme community in Owode and its surrounding creeks.

The Customs Area Controller (CAC) in charge of the command, Aliyu Mohammed, who disclosed this in a statement, made available to newsmen on Sunday, put the Duty Paid Value (DPV) of the

seized product at over N10 million.

Mohammed, who noted that the smuggling of petroleum products in jerry cans had been a recurring decimal that Customs operatives always intercepted, added that it had been the command's modest contribution to ameliorating the suffering of Nigerian masses over the current shortage of petrol in the country.

According to the Controller, "the operational norms of the Seme border of the Nigeria Customs Service does not allow trucks or tankers of petroleum products to cross the Nigerian territory, either through the Seme main border or its
