Pulle harane Teenager strangulates 8-yr-old brother to death

T least 37 suspects, including a 'pastor' who allegedly specialised in sponsoring kidnappers and armed robbers, as well as a teenager who killed his stepbrother by sitting on his head while asleep were on Thursday paraded by the Delta State Police Command.

The sum of N4 million, some foreign currencies, loaded English-made double-barrelled gun, 3,871 live cartridges, prohibited drugs, including Tramadol, were recovered when the police stormed the residence of the cleric, Reverend Ignatius Ogboi and a businessman at Umunede.

The money was believed to be the ransom collected from kidnapped victims, the state Commissioner of Police, Muhammad A. Mustafa, said.

Parading the suspects, the police boss said Chinedu 18-year-old, Efemene strangulated his stepbrother, one Oghenekaro Efemene, eight-yearold, at their residence at Ofagbe in Isoko axis of the state, by sitting on the head and holding his two hands until he noticed that he had stopped breathing before sneaking out of the

teenager, who The claimed to have acted on orders of a spirit, said he killed his stepbrother because their father hated him and his mother while he loved the deceased and his mother, adding: "I wanted my father to feel the pain."

The commissioner said that eight suspects were arrested in connection with the attack on and kidnap of one Izunna Emere Pascal opposite Untouchable Church, Agbor.

When the gang released

fied her husband's clothing and shoe worn by one of the suspects, Chima Ugwu Chekubechukwu, a few days later.

She also identified the suspect as one of the kidnappers of her husband while the victim's phone and personal property were recovered from him.

According to police commissioner, Nnamuoh, (35) had practised as a lawyer for five years, won many cases in courts and was attached to many law firms in the course of her illegal duties.

Nigerian Tribune learnt that though the suspect hailed from Iyiawu village in Onitsha, Anambra State, she resided in Okporo, Orlu Local Government Area of Imo State until her arrest.

Exhibits recovered from her included lawyers' gown, wig, collaret and letter head papers, among others.

newsmen, Addressing the commissioner said that the suspect was arrested at Orlu after defrauding unsuspecting members of the public of various sums of money totaling over N342,000.

According to him, "the suspect defrauded unsuspecting members of the public of their money, under the pretence of selling auctioned vehicles to them, having severally posed as a lawyer."

Ezike, however, observed that the suspect, in the course of investigation, confessed to being a fake lawyer.
