"The fuel exploded in the process, and there was nothing anyone could do to save her life," one of them

Graphic images and videos sent to NAN showed the woman lying motionless in flames beside her burning motorcycle, with sympathisers watching and wailing from afar.

In one of the images, firefighters could be seen extinguishing the flame around the woman's burnt remains.

Public Relations Officer of the state police command Andrew Aniamaka, confirmed the incident to NAN

Aniamaka said the drive of the vehicle had been taken into custody, whil investigation was ongoin into the circumstances sur rounding the incident.

Residents told NAN that Tuesday's accident was th fourth fatal case recorde in Oghara within the las one week.

## 2 corps members die as tipper lorry hits tricycle in Bayelsa

Safety FEDERAL Road Corps (FRSC), on day, confirmed the death of two National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) members in an auto crash in Bayelsa

The Sector Commander in the state, Mr Ikechukwu Igwe, told the News Nigeria of Agency (NAN) in Yenagoa that two other corps members were injured in the incident.

Yes, the incident occurred on Monday at Swali Bridge in Yenagoa Local Government Area of Bayelsa; the tricycle the corps members boarded was hit by a tipper

"Two among them died while two others who were injured are receiving treatment at the Federal Medical Centre, Yenagoa.

"Today, Tuesday, our personnel will be going to the hospital to check on how they are responding to treatment," Igwe said.

Reacting to the incident, State Coordinator, NYSC, Mrs Loto Bolade-Omolayo, described the incident as "unfortunate."

"Two of the corps members died as a result of the injuries sustained during

the accident, while the other two are being treated by a team of competent consultants at the FMC.

"The NYSC family is saddened by this sudden loss. We commiserate with their families on this unfortunate incident and pray for the repose of the souls of the dead and quick recovery of the injured corps members," she stated.

## 21-yr-old to die by hanging for robbing policemen of motorcycles

AN Ekiti State High Court sitting in Ado Ekiti has sentenced a 21-year-old man, Abdulateef Babatunde, to death for armed robbery.

The court, presided over by Justice Dele Omotoso, ruled that Babatunde should die by hanging for robbing a policeman and one other of their motorcycles.

count charge of armed robbery brought against him by the prosecution.

Babatunde was accused of robbing one Sergeant Kayode Babatimilehin of his Bajaj motorcycle with registration number GED 550 QA, on or about June 16, 2016 at NTA Road in Ado Ekiti.

According to the charge sheet, the accused also cle with registration number ADK 193 QH.

The prosecution said the convict, while committing the robbery, was armed with offensive weapons, including a gun.

Babatunde was said to have stopped Babatimilehin and asked for his hackney ticket but the policeman told the convict that he was not a commercial motorcycle operator.
