FRSC declares war on fake driving schools

Targets regular training for instructors to reduce accidents

THE Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) has emphasised its decision to train and retrain driving school operators in order to reduce the rate of road traffic accident in the country.

Speaking during a national workshop organised

Ajimobi said as the government continued in its efforts towards rehabilitating and reconstructing roads across the state, it had realised that the majority of accidents were caused by human factor.

Anaele, whose plea was not taken, appeared on a charge for murder.

Earlier, Inspector Cousin Adams told the court that the accused committed the offence on June 15, at about 11:45p.m., at 72, Goodness Estate, Satellite Town, Lagos. Adams said that the accused had found out that someone gave his wife, Chinyere (35), the sum of N200, which did not go down well with him.

"This angered the accused, who beat up his wife to death for collecting the money," Inspector Adams said.

The offence contravened Section 223 of the Criminal Law of Lagos State, 2015, which prescribes a death sentence for offenders.

The magistrate adjourned the case till August 6.
