

## Bus conductor dies, 6 others injured in Ogun auto crash

**T**HE Ogun State Sector Command of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC), on Tuesday, said that a bus conductor died, while six others sustained various degrees of injuries in an accident that involved two vehicles at Sawmill, at Alakuko area.

The state FRSC sector commander, Mr Clement Oladele, who confirmed the incident to the *News Agency of Nigeria (NAN)* in Ota, said the acci-

dent happened around 12.15 p.m.

Oladele explained that an LT bus with registration number KTU 536 XH, which was heading towards Oshodi, lost control due to brake failure and rammed into a stationary truck marked AAA 536 XJ.

The sector commander said that six persons were injured, while the bus conductor died on the spot.

"The body of the victim was taken to AIT Police Station Alagbado, while

the injured were receiving intensive treatment at General Hospital, Ile-Epo, Agbado, Oke-Odo," he said.

Oladele also said that officials of the FRSC, the Lagos State Emergency Management Authority (LASEMA) and the police rushed to

scene of the incident to rescue the victims and clear the gridlock to ease free flow of traffic in the area.

He advised motorists to

adhere strictly to average speed limit and ensure that their vehicles were in proper condition before putting them on the road.
