Daramola said insurgents were also killed in the operation which was carried out on intelligence reports.

He disclosed that the reports indicated that the settlement was one of the locations from where the terrorists launched attacks ontroops' positions and villages around Kumshe.

"Accordingly, the ATF launched a coordinated attack on various targets

The spokesman said that NAF, working in concert with surface forces, would sustain the tempo of operations, with a view to destroying all remnants of the terrorists in Borno.
