One dies as bus rams into truck on Lagos/Ibadan highway

A female passenger, on Monday, died after the commercial bus in which she was

travelling on the Lagos/Ibadan highway attempted to overtake a truck but rammed into it from behind. According to the Public Re-

lations Officer (PRO) of the Ogun State Traffic Compliance and Enforcement Corps, Mr Babatunde Akinbiyi, the bus, a *Toyota Hummer*,

with registration number KTU 489 XP, which had 10 males and six female passengers, was on top speed when it attempted to overtake the

Mack truck with registration number BDG 95 XU.

The TRACE PRO, who said the accident happened at 12:40 p.m at Eldorado area on the highway, confirmed the death of a female passenger as a result of the crash.

Akinbiyi said the body of the victim had been deposited at Fakoya Hospital mortuary at Sagamu by officials of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC), while the injured were taken to the Supreme Global Hospital, opposite the Redemption Camp.

Suspected vandal found dead inside NNPC pipeline in Ogun

THE Nigerian Security and Civil Defence Corps (NSCDC), Ogun State command, has confirmed the recovery of the body of a 45-year-old man in the middle of the Nigeria National Petroleum Corporation (NNPC) Premium Motor Spirit (PMS) pipeline at Gbaga axis in Ogijo

and oil thieves in the state.

Ogbonnaya said that the command's anti-vandal team would continue to work to combat vandalism in the state.

The statement read: "On Sunday, around 5:55 a.m, during our routine patrol

along the NNPC's Right of Way/ Pipeline at Gbaga axis in Ogijo, a lone deceased vandal, identified as Musa Oladipupo (45), was found in the middle of Premium Motor Spirit (PMS) deep down in the pipeline.

"The anti-vandal team recovered an empty 30-litre keg and a funnel from the deceased vandal.

"The state commandant, Everestus Obiyo, who earlier this week, had read the riot act on vandalism, warned that youths should

desist from all acts capable of endangering their lives, and all forms of crime.

"He also charged parents to be more responsible in their core duty of proper parenting to avoid acts that tarnish one's family name," he said.
