HERE was pande-Aluko Garage area of Ajilosun in Ado hit his car at the back. Ekiti, the Ekiti State capital, on Thursday, as gunmen shot and killed a yet-to-beidentified man believed to have been driving on the Ado-Ikere road.

Witnesses said that the incident occurred on Thursday morning.

The man was said to have been shot in the head and in the stomach by his assailants and was left in the pool of his blood, a scenario which caused confusion in the neighbourhood and at the garage.

A source at the scene of the incident alleged that "the man was in monium at Tosin the car and the vehicle conveying the gunmen

"The deceased then alighted from the car to complain over the reckless driving, not knowing they were gunmen. The bandits opened fire on him and he died immediately," the source said.

The source added that the gunmen sped off in their vehide after the man had been shot dead.

Residents, drivers and other members of the National Union of Road Transport Workers (NURTW), who arrived for work at the motor park, had to flee the
