Troops kill 37 bandits, arrest six, free 80 abductees

ROOPS of Nigerian Army, which launched simultaneous operations designed to decimate banditry activities in Zamfara and other contiguous states, have continued to dominate the areas of operation with aggressive patrols.

According to Abiade: "The troops had several encounters with bandits during the period in focus and neutralised 37 bandits while about six suspected bandits were also arrested during the period.

women and children from communities in Zamfara State".

It also revealed that it is important to observe that these successes were achieved at a price, where a total of six soldiers lost their lives in the process along Bini Maru

Local Government Area while returning to base after a long range patrol.
