Chemist arraigned over death of woman after abortion

AN Ado-Ekiti Magistrates' Court in Ekiti State, on Monday, remanded a 40-year-old chemist, Folake Oluwafemi, who allegedly performed an abortion that led to death of a lady.

According to the News Agency of Nigeria (NAN), the defendant, whose address was not provided, was charged with manslaughter before a magistrate, Mrs Omolola Akosile.

The prosecutor, Inspector Monica Ikebuilo, told the court that Oluwafemi carried out an abortion on one Miss Oluwabukola Adeosun, and it caused her death.

Ikebuilo said that the defendant committed the offence on February 20 at Ijero-Ekiti.

According to the prosecutor, the abortion resulted in complications and Adeosun was taken to a hospital where she died.

The prosecutor noted that manslaughter contravened Section 325 of the Criminal Code, Laws of Ekiti, 2012.

The court did not take the plea of the defendant, as the magistrate ordered that the case file should be duplicated and sent to the state Director of Public Prosecution (DPP) for advice.

Akosile ordered that the accused should be kept in prison and adjourned the case till April 4.
