Nigerian, Cameroonian troops kill 27 Boko Haram terrorists

ROOPS from NIGERIA and Cameroon, during joint clearance operations, killed 27 Boko Haram terrorists, while destroying several gun-trucks and recovering arms and ammunition belonging to them.

According to the News Agency of Nigeria (NAN), the acting Director, Army Public Relations, Colonel Sagir Musa, confirmed this in a statement on Monday.

Colonel Musa said the troops' encounter with the terrorists took place in the northern part of Wulgo,

Tumbuma, Chikun Gudu and Bukar Maryam villages. He said that no casualty was recorded on the part of the Nigerian and Cameroonian forces.

Musa listed items recovered as five gun-trucks, five AK-47 rifles, one automatic revolver, Galil rifle, one G3 rifle, two General Purpose Machine gun and two anti-aircraft guns.

He said others were four

He said others were four rocket-propelled gun tubes, one PK machine gun, one M21 rifle, one locally-made dane gun, five rocket-propelled gun tube bombs and 1,000 rounds of different

calibre ammunition.

Also recovered from the terrorists were five AK-47 magazines, several links of 12.7mm ammunition, one Land Cruiser Buffalo, one Nissan GT, several motorcycles, one flag and a grinding machine, while one Landcruiser was despendent of the control o

troyed.

Musa said coordinated military operation was ongoing, especially on the fringes of Gombaru-Ngala and surrounding areas to deal with terrorists fleeing from the onslaught of the Multinational Joint Task Force (MJTF).
