Five feared killed in Lagos cult clashes

NO fewer than five persons have been reportedly killed as rival cult groups clashed at Lekki, Ojota and Ijanikin areas of Lagos State in the last few weeks.

The police image-maker in the state, DSP Bala Elkana however denied being aware of any of the clashes.

Nigerian Tribune gathered that suspected cult members had been on rampage in many parts of the state in the last few weeks, with the killing of suspected rival members at Ikorodu, Ajah, Okokomaiko, Lekki and Ojota.

lt was gathered that one person was on Monday stabbed to death around Jakande bus stop at Lekki Phase 1, as two rival cult groups clashed.

It took the intervention of anti-riot policemen from the Rapid Response Squad to disperse the warring cult groups which had reportedly been battling for superiority for some weeks now.

It was gathered that the latest Lekki clash started some weeks ago when some members of one of the cult groups were killed and three of them beheaded.

A police source told the Nigerian Tribune that members of the rival cult groups had been on the lookout for rival cult members since then.

A yet-to-be-identified member of one of the groups was on Monday attacked at Lekki Phase 1 bus stop and was inflicted with machete cuts that led to his death.

An eye witness told the Nigerian Tribune that "they had killed him when I got to the scene, but he had cuts on his head and his stomach.

In a related development, no fewer than four suspected cult members were killed during different cult clashes at Ojota and Ijanikin areas of the state.
