THE Bauchi State chapter of the Peoples Democratic Movement (PDM) has withdrawn its petitions filed against the election of Bauchi State governor, Bala Mohammed Abdulkadir. at the State Governorship Election Tribunal. This was just as the crisis rocking the Bauchi State House, following the emergence of two Speakers, is now over as the leader of the aggrieved faction, former Speaker of the House, Kawuwa Shehu Damina, led 16 other members-elect to take oath of office and allegiance at a special session held on Friday night.

Chairman of the tribunal, Justice Salihu Shuaibu, granted the withdrawal of the party's petitions on Saturday at the tribunal sitting in Bauchi.
