

## Boko Haram kills eight soldiers in Borno

MEMBERS of the deadly terror group, Boko Haram, on Friday, ambushed another patrol team of soldiers, killing eight in the latest attack.

The insurgents, after the ambush of the convoy, were said to have destroyed about three gun trucks and carted some weapons.

A reliable security source disclosed that the convoy, which was moving from Monguno to Maiduguri, in Borno State, was attacked at Gasarwa village, not far from Gajiram, which is a few kilometres from Monguno.

The source said three gun trucks were allegedly burnt down by the terrorists, while some of the soldiers manning the trucks were rushed to Sector 3 headquarters by reinforcement that were quick to dash to the scene from their camp in Mungunu.

In a swift reaction, Theatre Commander, Major General Olusegun Adeniyi, rushed to the location of the ambush late Friday to see things for himself.

Restriction of movement from Monguno to Maiduguri was imposed to enable the troops comb the area for remnants of the insurgents, a development that left passengers going to Maiduguri by stranded for hours.
