Police commence manhunt for killers of another lady in Delta

THE Delta State Police Command has commenced an investigation into the circumstances surrounding the death of a young lady found in Sapele, Delta State on Monday.

The body of the yet-to-be-identified lady was discovered at about 9:00a.m., on New Ogorode road, close to the Naval base in Sapele, Sapele Local Government Area.

Curiously, this is coming barely three weeks after the decomposing corpse of a 24-four-year-old lady was discovered under the bed in a popular hotel in Sapele.

Local reports said the body of the deceased, also in her late 20s, was discovered by passersby who alerted men of a vigilance group in the area, before the police were drafted to the scene.

It was gathered that the deceased had a slit in the neck and some other parts of her body, and was found

in the pool of her blood, suggesting she was severally stabbed to death.

Blood was said to be dripping from her throat and other parts of the body when police operatives from Sapele were evacuating her body from the scene to a morgue.

Commissioner of Police, Delta State, Mr Yinka Adeleke, told journalists Tuesday on phone that investigation into the killing had yet to be concluded.

The latest killing brings the number to three females gruesomely murdered in mysterious circumstances in the past two months in Sapele alone.

Meanwhile, residents of Sapele and its environs have begun to attribute the killings to the unchecked activities of what they termed "Ghana Buggers" popularly referred to as "G-boys or Yahoo Plus Plus," which many idle youths have bought into to acquire quick wealth.
