Cult leader, 8 others arrested for allegedly killing 30-yr-old man in Lagos

HE leader of a cult group, Aive Confraternity that had been terrorising residents of Ikorodu area of Lagos State in the last couple of weeks has been arrested by men of the Lagos State police command.

Eight other members of the group that had made life miserable for residents of Agbowa, liede, Owutu, Ipakodo and Owode-Onirin were also nabbed by the police.

The arrested cult members are reportedly responsible for the trail of other suspected the death of 30-year-old David, members of the gang. Nwanga, who was killed last Wednesday during a clash at Adamo area of Ikorodu.

The state Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), Bala Elkana, while confirming the

arrest of the suspects in a statement signed by him on Sunday and made available to the Nigerian Tribune, said the police were already on

Elkana said: "The Special Strike Force on Social Miscreants arrested a deadly Aiye Confraternity kingpin, Sikiru (surname withheld) and eight members of his gang in

Ikorodu and recovered one double-barreled gun from them."

Elkana added that "the state Commissioner of Police. Hakeem Odumosu, has deployed a Special Strike Force on Social Miscreants to Ikorodu to sustain the ongoing onslaught on cultists and other social miscreants in Ikorodu, Imota, Agbowa, Owutu, liede, Ipakodo and

Owode Onirin.

"The operation, which is intelligence driven, has recorded another remarkable achievement with the arrest of Sikiru (24) at Imota. "

Elkana said the ages of the other suspects ranged from 18 to 30 years.

"The gang is responsible for series of violent attacks and gang violence in Imota and environs. One of such violent at-

tacks happened on Febru at about 8:30 a.m., which the death of one David N from Araro Adamo area."

The suspects were h over to the homicide s of the State Criminal In ation Department (CID for discreet investigation

Elkana assured that the pects would be charged t upon conclusion of invest into their alleged crimes.
