

## FG Condemns Execution Of Five Aid Workers In Borno

The Minister of Humanitarian Affairs, Disaster Management and Social Development, Sadiya Umar Farouq, on Saturday, condemned in strong terms, the recent execution of five Humanitarian Aid Workers in Borno State.

The Minister, who expressed regrets via a statement obtained by ***Tribune Online***, condoled with the Borno State Government and the Humanitarian Community over the execution of 5 Aid Workers by Boko Haram

“I received with great sadness yesterday, the news of the execution by Boko Haram of five humanitarian workers who had earlier been abducted while carrying out the much-needed humanitarian work in the North East.

“The slain persons are believed to be aid workers captured during a raid in Monguno Local Government Area of Borno State on June 13, 2020.

“This incident is a great loss to the humanitarian family of which, we, at the Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs, Disaster Management and Social Development are a member.

“On behalf of the Ministry, I send my condolence to the Governor of Borno State H.E Prof Babagana Zulum, the Borno State Emergency Management Agency, Action Against Hunger, Rich International and the International Rescue all of whom lost staff in this dastardly incident. I extend our sympathy to the bereaved families and the whole humanitarian community in Nigeria.

“This incident once more underlines the huge sacrifices being made by humanitarian workers who work alongside this Ministry to see that the vulnerable populations are given succour.

“In spite of this setback, I would like to assure all humanitarian workers in Nigeria that this Ministry will continue to assist in ensuring that the lives of humanitarian workers are protected in line with International Humanitarian Law, and by interfacing between the Nigerian security agencies and the humanitarian workers rendering lifesaving assistance in Nigeria. May the souls of the departed aid workers rest in peace, Amen.”
