

How police killed my husband during protest, woman tells Ekiti panel

At the resumed hearing of the Ekiti State Judicial Panel of Inquiry into allegations of police brutality and other human rights abuses, one Mrs Tolu Abolarinwa has narrated how her husband, Odunayo Abolarinwa was killed by a police officer during the #EndSARS protest in

the state.

The mother of three said her husband who was a fashion designer was shot dead on October 20, in Oye-Ekiti..

The woman who wept uncontrollably during the hearing said, "All I want is justice and compensation for me to take care of three children left behind by my

husband."

Also, during the sitting a journalist, Mr Olugbolade Ogboro appeared before the panel to defend his petition over alleged attack on him by hoodlums during the #EndSARS protest.

According to him, he was attacked on October 16 when he was leaving the State House of Assembly

complex alongside the convoy of the governor where he sustained bodily injuries.

The Chairman of the Panel, Justice Cornelius Akintayo (retd) who adjourned sitting to November 19, however, frowned at how some complainant abandoned and failed to defend their petitions before the panel.
