Police discover IPOB/ESN herbalist's burnt body in Imo

THE Imo State police command has discovered the burnt body of the Indigenous People of Biafra (IPOB)/Eastern Security Network (ESN) herbalist identified as Pascal Okeke in one of their camps.

The discovery came following the ceaseless raids by police operatives on IPOB/ESN camps all over the state.

The Commissioner of Police in the state, Abutu Yaro, in a statement signed by the Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO) of the command, CSP Michael Abattam, said the command carried out successful raids that neutra-

lised the terror groups.

He said the remnants of IPOB /ESN terror groups turned the gun on their herbalist, one Paschal Okeke, of Umudim Ukwu Orji Awomama in Oru East Local Government Area of the state.

According to Yaro, members of the group shot Okeke, cut his remains, decapitated the head and burnt the body and his house for the failure of the charms he had given them over time.

Yaro said large sums of money had been funnelled to the deceased in the hope that he would make them invisible and protect them from the bullets of security operatives.
