

Again, 11 killed, many missing as suspected herdsmen attack Taraba community

ABOUT 11 people have been confirmed killed and scores said to be missing following the attack on a Tiv village in Gassol Local Government Area of Taraba State by suspected Fulani herdsmen.

Nigerian Tribune gathered that the herdsmen launched the attack following a suspicion against the Tivs in an area where a Fulani man was robbed and killed while returning from

Sensani, a village market, on Monday.

A resident of the area, Mr David Korbee, who lost his brother during the Tuesday's attack, told journalists that two of his female children were still missing.

"We recovered six bodies yesterday (Wednesday) and buried them today (Thursday). This morning, the vigilante personnel found four more bodies in the bush and we intend to bury them this afternoon.

"As we speak, many people are still missing and we can't say whether they are alive or dead. The herdsmen are hunting and killing people on their farms. So, it is difficult to ascertain the actual casualty figures," he said.

Chief of Bantaje Chiefdom, Yahaya Abubakar Rufai, in whose domain the attack happened, confirmed the incident and said six farmers were killed at a bolder between Gassol and Wukari local government areas. Meanwhile, the Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO) in the state, DSP Abdullahi Usman, did not respond to calls and text message sent to his mobile phone for the command's confirmation.
