## Joint security task force kills 100 suspected terrorists in Niger

The Commissioner of Police, Mr. Bala Monday Kuryas, who confirmed the killing during an interactive session with newsmen, also hinted that some of the

Mr. Emmanuel Umar, told the **Nigerisn Tribune**: "We are really making progress in the ongoing fight against bandits, kidnappers, cattle rustlers and other criminal elements in our state.

"The exchange of gun fire between the gunmen suspected to be terrorist elements and the Joint Security Task Force and vigilante outfits led to the killing of several bandits.

"We also recovered over 61 motorcycles during the operation," he stated.
