An articulated truck, as reliably informed, overran the motorbike otherwise known as okada in which they were riding at the Caretaker area along the Ilorin-Ogbomoso expressway.

Tunde, nicknamed Tunde Aluta who celebrated his 49th birthday on Monday was a state delegate to the just concluded APC convention in Abuja.

An eyewitness account stated that the victims were returning from a meeting at the Idi Abebe area when the incident happened.

Our correspondent gathered that Tunde who was said to be a youth let the spot while Sabitu died at an undisclosed hospital.
