The Hunters Council of Nigeria, Ofu Chapter in Kogi State have killed two suspected Kidnappers along Okele/Ochadamu road in the early hours of Wednesday.

The men of the hunters ambushed the criminal elements after discovering their hideouts in Ochadamu at about 2 am.
