

# Bandits kill lecturer who delivered ransom to secure release of abducted village head in Adamawa

**BANDITS** have killed a lecturer with the Federal College of Education, Yola, Adamawa State, Joram Bengo, after collecting a N7 million ransom.

The bandits had earlier kidnapped the village head of Bengo in Fufere Local Government Area of the state, Sallau Manu, last September, and the lecturer was kidnapped on September 25, after he delivered N2million ransom to secure the release of the village head.

The bandits had on September 30, killed the village head after collecting the N2million ransom brought by the lecturer.

**Nigerian Tribune** gathered that the bandits were angered by the amount brought by the lecturer for

the release of the village head and he was killed, while his family was contacted to come for his remains.

A family member of the lecturer, on Monday, informed newsmen that he had also been murdered after the payment of N7 million ransom.

The source said: "Joram Bengo took the N2million ransom to them [bandits] around September 25, but they refused to release either him or our village head.

"They contacted us again demanding additional money and we struggled to raise N7 million and sent to them after several assurances that he would be released to us.

"But sadly, we found his decomposing remains at the foot of Bagale hills on Sunday evening."

Spokesperson for the state police command SP Sulei-

man Nguroje, confirmed the incident.
