

Father demands arrest, prosecution of son's killers in Sokoto

Mohammed Danjuma, has cried out demanding justice over his son's gruesome murder in Sokoto.

Mohammed (34), a graduate of Nigerian Maritime Academy, Oron, was murdered on July 7, within the neighbourhood at Clapperton

Road in Sokoto.

While narrating the trauma the family is going through to newsmen in Sokoto, the father alleged that there are plans to scuttle investigation and prosecution of suspects linked to his son's murder.

The 62-year-old father said five months after the death of his son, those suspected of involvement are still walking on the streets as free men.

"There is the evidence of a trending video where my son was handcuffed, tortured, dehumanised and debased before he gave up the ghost.

"I am, therefore, using this opportunity to call on the Sokoto State government and Federal Government, Inspec-

tor-General of Police (IGP), human rights organisations and the media to help get justice for my son."

When contacted over the development, the Sokoto State Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), DSP Abubakar Sanusi, promised to get the necessary information on the case and brief newsmen accordingly.
