Ondo Amotekun says over 20 okada riders killed in last three weeks, launches Ember months patrol

Hakeem Gbadamosi | Akure on commercial motorcyclists in the state, saying no fewer than 20 okada riders had been killed in the last three weeks. THE commander of Ondo State Security Network, code-named Amotekun Corps, Chief Adetunji Adeleye, has expressed worries over the upsurge in cases of attacks and Joint Border Patrol to ensure crime-free yuletide, said motorcyclists have become targets of criminals in the state. He, however, said the ban on commercial motorcycles from 6:00p.m.

to 6:00a.m. as put in place by the government remains, while unregistered vehicles and those with tinted glass would be impounded.

The Amotekun commander said: "We want to

appeal to commercial motorcyclists to go and rest after working for 12 hours so that we can identify the criminal elements."

He added that, "It is also no longer permitted for vehicles to ply the road

without registration numbers and all vehicles with tinted glass should obtain police permit for them.

"Dealers should use dealer numbers and not stickers because all vehicles with stickers will be impounded."
