

Troops raid terrorists' camp in Sambisa forest, kill four

NIGERIAN Army high command has said its troops deployed in the North East as part of ongoing counter-insurgency operations have conducted a successful raid operation on a terrorists' camp in the Arra area of Sambisa forest.

This was contained in a statement made available to newsmen in Abuja by the Director, Army Public Relations, Major-General Onyema Nwachukwu.

According to the statement, during the operation carried out on Friday, the troops killed three terrorists,

including a suicide bomber and destroyed their enclave in the area.

It stated that after a thorough search, troops recovered two AK-47 rifles and a suicide vest.

The statement added that in another operation, troops conducted a clearance operation in the Buluwa area of Kukawa Local Government Area of Borno State, where they uncovered and destroyed

another terrorists' camp.

According to the statement, "in the encounter, troops killed one terrorist and recovered one AK-47 rifle, 14 rounds of 7.62mm (Special), a bicycle, foodstuff, a grinding machine and other items."

The statement assured that the Nigerian Army remained committed to the eradication of terrorism and insurgency in the region.
