

# Abiodun's former aide, Odemuyiwa, dies in auto crash

JOSEPH ODEMUYIWA, former aide of Governor Dapo Abiodun of Ogun State, Professor, is dead. He was aged 66.

He was the immediate former Senior Special Adviser to Prince Dapo Abiodun on Vocational and Technical Education.

Odumuyiwa, who was a Professor of Business Education, reportedly died in

an auto crash that occurred along Ibadan-Abeokuta road, on his way to a private university where he was a lecturer.

Meanwhile, Governor Abiodun has described the death of Odemuyiwa as a great loss to the state and its education sector.

Abiodun, in a condolence message, described the passing of Professor Odemuyiwa as tragic and sad, adding that his death is a great loss to the state, his family, and the edu-

cation sector.

He said the erstwhile special adviser was a team player who contributed immensely to the success recorded by his administration in the vocational and technical education during first term in office.

"Odumuyiwa's legacy as an educator and advocate will always be remembered and cherished.

"He was a highly respected individual who made significant contributions to the

"His sudden departure leaves a void that will be felt by many and will be sorely missed by all," Prince Abiodun said.

He sympathised with the family of the deceased and prayed for the repose of his soul.

"Please, accept my deepest condolences during this difficult time. May his soul rest in peace," the governor added.
