Urhobo leader condemns gas pipeline exclusion plan

THE National Chairman of the Urhobo Oil and Gas Nationality (UROAGAN), Chief ObiuwevbiOminimini, has strongly opposed the Federal Government's plan to establish five mini Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) plants in Kogi State using gas sourced from Urhobo land without hosting any of the plants in the Urhobo Nation.

In a press statement obtained by our reporter on Saturday, Chief Ominimini called on President Bola Tinubu. the Managing Director of the Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited (NNPCL), and the Chief Executive of the Nigeria Upstream Petroleum Regulatory Commission (NU-PRC) to halt the implementation of the project, labelling it as oppressive and unjust to the Urhobo people.

"The Urhobo ethnic nationality has the highest reserves of gas and crude oil in Nigeria but has nothing to show for it.

"Our graduates are left roaming the streets, some riding okadas, while top northern elites secure employment in the oil and gas sector," he lamented.
