## Tipper driver, 10 others die in attack by police, accident

No fewer than 11 persons were feared dead on Wednesday in two separate incidents in Anambra State involving an accident, and an encounter between riot policemen and a tipper driver.

Investigations by our correspondent on Wednesday showed that the accident, in which 10 persons reportedly lost their lives,
