Collapsed building: Two more victims

die in P'Harcourt WO out of the four victims

of a building which collapsed in Port Harcourt on

Tuesday, have died. Some of the site workers

gave the names of the dead simply as Sule and Suraiu. One of the victims, Mr.

Tunde Bola, a carpenter, who was on the roof when the building collapsed, however, survived. He attributed his survival to God.

Bola said that Sule was a vounger brother of the engineer who is handling the project. He declined to disclose

the name of the engineer. He said that Sule and Suraju died late on Tuesday at the hospital they were taken to for treatment but he could not remember the name of the hos-

pital. He said, "Two of my friends could not make it. They died. But two of us survived by the mercy of God," Narrating the incident, he said that he was on top of the roof when he heard a loud noise and

jumped. According to him, he became unconscious after that and woke up in a hospital where he was about to be Xraved.

He added that the families

of the dead had been contacted while other victims would be flown to Lagos State on Thursday for further treatment.

The Rivers State Commissioner for Housing and Urban Development, Mr. Marshal Uwom, on Wednesday said that the building did not have an approval from his ministry.
