Students go wild over mate's death in auto crash

STUDENTS of Nawar-Ud-Deen Grammar School, Idi-Baba area of Oke-Bale, Osogbo, went on the rampage on Wednesday following the death of their mate, Mumini Isiaka, in an auto accident.

Isiaka, a Senior Secondary School student of the school, was on a commercial motorcycle when the accident occurred.

Sources said that Isiaka died on the spot after an oncoming lorry, which had no chance to manoeuvre, crushed him.

Piqued by the death of their mate, students of the school, especially SS 3 students, rallied their juniors for a peaceful protest after burning the lorry and the motorcycle.

The protest took the students to the palace of the Ataoja of Osogbo, Oba Iyiola Matanmi, where the students were placated.

They later moved to the Divisional Police Station, Oja-Oba, where the Divisional Police Officer, Mr. Benedict Yusufu, ap-

pealed to them not to take the law into their hands.

Police Public Relations Officer, Osun State Command, Mr Joshua Olayemi, said a thorough investigation into the case had begun.
