A middle-aged man was confirmed dead on Monday as a result of the injuries he sustained from an

injuries he sustained from an explosion fire that erupted in a vandalised oil pipeline in Ogale in Eleme Local

Government Area of Rivers State. The man, whose name

was given as Obo Awala, met his untimely death in his attempt to scoop oil

from the sprawling pipelines that take crude from the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation to other parts of the country through

Eleme.

Eyewitnesses told our correspondent that the man had successfully scooped petrol from one of the damaged trucks and was about
