Gunmen kill seven in P'Harcourt

S OME gunmen, sus pected to be cultists, killed seven persons on New Year day in Port Harcourt. Eyewitnesses said the

gunmen, who were dressed in military fatigue, opened fire on their victims near Rumuosi and Rumuokini in Obio/Akpor Local Govern-

ment Area.

One of the victims was a policeman, who was caught in the crossfire as he attempted to chase away the killers.

As at the time of filing this report, the cause of the attack was not known, but the natives of the community said it was triggered by

a fierce contest for the control of political space in the area.

Supporters of two cult

Supporters of two cult groups, sympathetic to some top politicians in the state, were involved in the attack.

One faction is said to have enjoyed support from

a top official of the present

administration, thereby in-

curring the wrath of the other faction.

The Police Public Relations Officer for Rivers State, Mrs. Ireju Barasua, confirmed the killings but she said the command was in-

mayhem.

She also said that one of the dead was a policeman.

Barasua said the com-

Communal and cult

clashes have been rampant in many parts of Rivers State, especially with the advent of political groups struggling to assert their su-

premacy.

The latest attack came barely one week after gunmen opened fire on their victims around Elelenwo on the
