Thugs strangulate man to death

Lagos State. Onvelekere was living with his parents in the building, which was said to have been sold to a manufactur-

ing company, by the own-

ers. Our correspondent learnt that the tenants were still discussing with the owner of the property, who had given them quit notice, when the incident happened on September 4.

The thugs allegedly besieged the premises in the early hours on that date, and strangulated the young man.

A Lagos-based lawyer, who is the spokesman for the Onyelekere family, Mr. respondent on Wednesday that the thugs were allegedly led by three persons (names withheld).
