10 die in Osogbo accident

NO fewer than 10 persons died in an auto crash involving a trailer; a passenger bus and a private car in Abere, near

Osogbo, on Sunday.

When our correspondent got to the scene of the accident at the front of the Assistant Inspector-General of Police's Office, officers of the

Federal Road Safety Commission and Fire Service were seen battling to keep out the fire, which emanated from the crash.

Five of the victims were burnt beyond recognition. Two recognisable victims were deposited with the five victims burnt beyond recognition.

It was gathered that no fewer than four more victims were trapped in the inferno that engulfed the vehicles.

Confirming the incident, the Sector Commander, Federal Road Safety Commission, Osun State, Mr. Baba Haldu, said six persons were confirmed dead in the crash.

Explaining that his officers were on a rescue operation at the scene, Haldu said the cause of the accident was yet to be ascertained.

When our correspondent got to the Ladoke Akintola University Teaching Hospital, Osogbo, where the victims were rushed to, no fewer than eight injured persons were on admission at the intensive care unit of the hospital.

The Akoda-Olaiya road on which the accident occurred, has been under construction in the last two years.

12 die in gas pipeline fire

O fewer than 12 persons were feared dead in the fire, which gutted the 10-inch gas pipeline servicing the Utorogu Gas Plant of the Dutch firm, Shell Petroleum Development Company, on Friday.

Findings by our correspondent shortly after the fire was put out on Saturday revealed that 12 persons burnt in the incident.

The deceased were illegal oil operators siphoning condensate, a by product of gas, from

pany, a subsidiary of the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation, following the incident.

Consequently, a daily shutin of 300 million standard cubic feet of gas resulted from the incident.

SPDC's spokesman, Mr. Precious Okolobo, in a statement on Friday, said the gas plant had been shut down, moment after the fire outbreak.

Meanwhile, SPDC's Media Officer in the western operation in Warri, Mr Obaigbo Aori, said the fire was put out at 2:51pm on Saturday. Aori, in text message to our correspondent, said, "Investigation into the cause and impact of the incident will be concluded tomorrow. [Monday].

But our correspondent learnt that a Joint Investigation Team, made up of all stakeholders in the nation's oil industry, including regulators, government officials, community representatives and Shell representatives would visit the scene on Monday, to ascetain the cause of the fire.

Aori said a detailed report on the fire incident would be available at the end of the investigation by the JIV team.

The report of the theft of condensate had been rampant in Ughelli and Udu Local Govemment Areas of Delta State in recent times. The circulation of condensate as kerosene in Delta state resulted in serial kerosene explosions in the various towns and communities in the state. About 15 persons died in the explosions at different parts of the state in Auqust.
