Uneasy calm in Kogi, 3 persons shot dead

INEC says it's prepared

LokoJA — Ahead of today's rerun of the gubernatorial polls in Kogi State, the state has literally turned into a war zone following several skirmishes across the state. At least three persons were shot dead and military men and the police taking over strategic places.

It was gathered that in the early hours of yesterday, a youth leader, Comrade Usman Audu in Ejule, Ofu local government and two other persons in Ayangba, Dekina local government were shot

dead.

This was followed by sporadic shooting in Ayangba following complaints from the youths who protested against the killings.

According to sources, Audu was shot at very close range at his Etiofegi residence

and he died instantly.

Saturday Vanguard also gathered that two armoured tanks were moved to Ogwolawo town, the commercial nerve centre of Ofu local government area, just as three trunk loads of soldiers were also dispatched to Ayangba and Ejule

AGOS- THE Branch ⊿manager of Equatorial Trust Bank (ETB) Apapa, was shot dead Thursday night by a gang of suspected assassins who rode on a motor bike popularly called Okada. Time was 8.30pm. Police said the identified as Mr. Moses Edueche met his sudden death after he had gone to visit a naval friend at the close of work and was attacked in traffic while driving home According to sources, the armed men numbering three who apparently were trailing late Edueche had accosted him, forced open his car and demanded that he hand over the money in his possession to them. He reportedly complied and handed over the N50, 000 in his possession to them without hesitation. However tragedy struck after the hoodlums who were not satisfied with the amount of money ordered him out of his car and started ransacking the vehicle. Dissatisfied with the loot, one of the suspected assassins pulled the trigger and fired him below the navel
