## Man killed for allegedly stealing N4,000

man suspected to have snatched N4,000 from a victim was killed in Lagos on Saturday during an encounter with the police.

The unidentified man was among a four-man gang that attacked drivers commuters about at midnight on Ojo-Igbede Road.

The men, said to be armed with guns, had allegedly robbed some other persons before pouncing on another victim who later called the police.

The bandits attacked the man, identified as Onanuga Adeniii. and snatched N4.000 from him at gunpoint.

It was learnt that immediately the robbers left Adeniii. he sent a distress call to the police and he was lucky that a police patrol team was some metres away

from the spot where he was robbed.

The policemen came to the scene and met the robbers somewhere along the road.

Our correspondent learnt that as soon as the robbers sighted the police, they made a spirited attempt to flee.

The security men chased them and there ensued an exchange of gunfire. During the cross-fire, one of the robbers was killed while the three other members to escaped.

One locally-made gun and five live cartridges were recovered from the dead robbery suspect.

In another development, some policemen attached to the Victoria Island division. have arrested a man with one double-barrelled shotgun and three live cartridges.

The suspect, whose name was given as Oluwaseun Oyeniyi, 25, was arrested on Kofo Abayomi Street,

Victoria Island.

It was learnt that Ovenivi. driving a Passat car with registration number XD 966 FST, was stopped by the policemen at "Cowrie Gate black spot."

He refused to stop and sped off. The policemen chased his car and caught up with him at Kofo Abayomi,

where he was forced to bring his vehicle to a halt.

The policemen were said to have become curious on the basis of the driver's action. This led to a thorough search of his car. During the search, the gun

and the cartridges were found in the vehicle.

Besides, two Nokia

telephone handsets, one Samsung handset and a sum of N4, 830 were found

on the suspect. He was promptly arrested and taken to the VI police station for interrogation.

Spokesman for the Lagos State Police Command, Mr. Frank Mba, confirmed both

Mba said the suspect in the second incident would soon be referred to the state Criminal Investigation Department, Panti, Yaba, for further investigation.

He said the dead suspect had been taken to a public mortuary in the state.

## Bandits kill PHCN worker, wreak havoc on Osogbo communities

RMED robbers have Continued to unleash terror on residents of Osogbo iust as an employee of the Power Holding Company of Nigeria, Mr. Sunday Babaqbemi, was killed by robbers who stormed his residence in Capital area of Osogbo.

Also. robbers terrorised residents of Gbodofon area of Osogbo, maiming residents and carting away valuables such as cell phones, jewellery, wristwatches and

An investigation by our correspondent on Sunday, in Osoqbo, showed that the late Babagbemi, who had just been transferred from Iwo PHCN office, was attached to the Distribution Unit of the power company. A source disclosed to our

correspondent that the deceased had put in 26 years of service before he met his aruesome end when robbers stormed his residence and shot him in the neck.

It was gathered that doctors battled to save the life

of his wife, who slumped, when she learnt of her husband's death.

Last week, residents of Ilupeiu and Oke-Onti were subjected to physical and emotional trauma when robbers raided houses in an operation that lasted for more than three hours.

A correspondent with the Daily Independent, Mr. Gbenga Faturoti, was among residents whose properties were carted away by robbers in Ilupeiu.

On Friday, a house was robbed on Peter Ajibola Street.

Alekuwodo, where robbers carted away bundles of clothes from a shop.
