Fire guts Sharia judge's home, kills four kids

Pour children were killed and one woman injured when fire gutted the residence of the judge of the Sharia Court of Appeal, Khadi Ibrahim Imam, on Friday, in Gwagwalada in the FCT.

Speaking to the News Agency of Nigeria on the incident, Imam said the fire started on Thursday night at 1a.m. and lasted for three hours before it was put under control. He said the fire was caused by an electrical spark from a generator, adding, "The four children were inside a separate room crying for help. We did everything to save them and firemen arrived only after their death."

He said among the four children, three were girls and were aged between seven years 18 years, while the boy was four years old. Commenting on the incident, the Gwagwalada area council chairman, Alhaji Zakari Angulu, expressed shock and condemned the Fire Service for arriving late. Angulu said a committee would be set up to investigate the nonchalant attitude of the fire service men and report to the minister.

In his reaction, Gwagwalada Fire Service Officer, Akinola Abayomi, renounced the blame and described the incident as unfortunate. He said, "We were only informed one hour after the incident. We got there and stopped the escalation of the fire," adding that inaccessibility to water was the bane of the service.

NAN reports that many personalities attended the

funeral prayers of the children including the Chief Judge of Abuja, Justice Muhammad Gumi.
