Policeman kills cyclist over alleged N20 bribe

policeman on Monday reportedly shot and killed a commercial motorcudist over an alleged N20 bribe at the 3-3 area of Onitsha, Anambra State.

An evewitness said a team of riot policemen attached to the 3-3 Police Division, who were supposed to be on a routine stop-and-search patrol. flagged down a commercial bus plying the 3-3 - Omeife route and demanded the N20 bribe from the driver who declined, daiming that he had earlier given them money.

One of the policemen, who was apparently angered by the defiance of the driver, raised his oun and corked it to threaten the driver. The latter threw the money at the policeman and sped off.

Tragedy, according to the evewitness, struck when the policeman pulled the trigger and a bullet hit an oncoming commercial motorcyclist who was heading towards Onitsha.

The codist died on the spot while the policeman fled.

Though a senior police officer at 3-3 confirmed the incident, the

Anambra State Chairman of the Nicerian Medical Association, Dr. Tochukwu Mbachu, was on Monday kidnapped from his home in Enugwu-Ukwu in Niikoka Local Government area unknown persons.

The kidnap came barely two weeks after a new couple was kidnapped on their wedding day at their home in nearby Nibo. They were later released.

An evewitness said the kidnappers stormed the home of Mbachu, abducted him and threw him in the boot of a vehicle belonging to the former Commissioner for Information. Chief Charles Amilo, and took off.

Amilio had come to the hospital with his aged mother for a medical checkup when the hoodlums struck.

The abducted chairman was last seen at the award ceremony of the NMA on Saturday evening at Queens Suite Hotel, Awka, where he presided over events.

Meanwhile, five armed riot policemen manning a checkpoint at Olaiva junction, Osoobo, fled when three armed robbers opened fire at a roadside phone shop opposite the checkpoint on Monday afternoon.

The robbers' ages ranged between 16 and 20 years.

The policemen fled into a dothes shop when they heard the first shot fired by one of the robbers.

An evewitness said the salesman raised his evebrows when one of the robbers smashed the glass shelf housingexpensive mobile telephone sets and this prompted his being shot twine

The robbers later sped off in their Nissan cartowards llesa route just as trafficcommotion ensued during and aftertherobberu.

The shot salesman was rushed to the Ladoke Akintola Teaching Hospital, Osogbo, by sympathisers.

Police Public Relations Officer. Osun State Command, Mr. Joshua Olavemi, said the incident would be investigated.
