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Two in police net over friend's death

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Two persons (a man and a woman) are currently in police net over the death of one of their female friends in Lagos on Tuesday.

The incident, our correspondent gathered, is still a source of worry to many residents of Boys' Town, Baruwa, Ipaja, where the victim died.

It was learnt that the deceased, Favour Uzogoh, of Block 424, Flat 5, Abesan Estate, Ipaja, went to her lover's house and returned in the evening.

Our correspondent further gathered that moments after Uzogoh came back home, she left for her girlfriend's house when she allegedly felt some uneasiness.

She was at her friend's place at Asalu Lawal Street, Boys' Town, Baruwa, when her condition rapidly deteriorated.

Uzogoh reportedly battled with death for three hours in her friend's house after which she passed on when all efforts to make her live failed.

The incident, our correspondent learnt, came as a rude surprise to Uzogoh's friend, who raised the alarm when she noticed that the lady had stopped breathing.

Some residents advised her to quickly visit the nearest police station and report the incident.

She did and policemen later visited the house and took the corpse to a public mortuary for autopsy.

It was gathered that the police were suspecting that Uzogoh's case might be that of murder.

The police have, therefore, arrested both Uzogoh's lover and her female friend for interrogation and investigation.

Spokesman for the Lagos State Police Command, Mr. Frank Mba, confirmed the incident to our correspondent on Wednesday.

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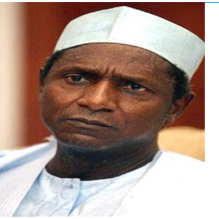
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
