N Apapa District Coroner's Court has begun an inquest to determine the circumstances leading to the alleged killing of a 24-year-old school leaver, Agbonosumua Imana, by men

have died in a controversial
manner on the bank of a river

along Ist Avenue Festac Town, Lagos on February 24, 2009.

Imana was reportedly sent on an errand by his 74 -year-old father on the fateful day and while he was talking with his friends less than 200 metres from their residence, they suddenly heard massive gunshots which prompted them to run to different directions, including the river. Though the deceased and his friends were still trying to come out of the river in which they had fallen, it was alleged

The development allegedly led to one of the heavy stones hitting the deceased in the eye, leading to his drowning and death.
