officials in the last three weeks. An evewitness told our correspondent on Tuesday that the deceased, whose identity

could not be immediately ascertained, was driving a commercial bus when he was stopped by a LASTMA official

simply identified as Adesina.

During the disagreement that followed, Adesina was said to have pushed the driver until he fell inside a nearby drainage. The driver, who was

suspected to have hit his head against the concrete wall of the drainage, reportedly died on the

spot. Consequently, a mob made up of evewitnesses and other commercial drivers reportedly attacked the LASTMA official.

He was said to have been beaten to a state of coma before the arrival of policemen who
