THERE was pandemonium ■ in Samonda area of Ibadan, Ovo State capital on Tuesday when some youths took to the street to protest a fatal accident

7.15am when some armed riot policemen on duty at a checkpoint on the Sango-Ojoo Road attempted to stop convoy

of four cars suspected to be driven by smugglers of used vehicles popularly called Tokunbo.

Three of the smugglers were said to be driving on top speed against the traffic at the time of the incident.

An eyewitness, Mr. Ismaila Emiola, alleged that when it became obvious that the suspects would not stop, the policemen started shooting. In their bid to escape,
