Crime Digest learnt from another source, who craved anonymity, that N41,500 cash and a bus boarding pass were found on the man, which suggested that the man travelled from Port Harcourt to Lagos. One of the sympathisers, simply known as Augustine, who had helped in the attempt of the motorists to revive the man, kept the money and the bus ticket.

"The items were in the custody of Augustine. He gave it to one of the park officials, but the official refused

to collect, saying he did not want to be implicated. Augustine later absconded with the money and the bus ticket," he said.

It was learnt that the park chairman, in company with some officials, rushed the **man** to Safe Hands Hospital, Maza Maza, where he reportedly died. .


A **police** source, however, believed that the **bus** ticket Augustine absconded with, was very crucial in solving the mystery of who the **man** was. The source added that the **police** were working on the theory that the **man** might have been drugged.

"The bus ticket would help in solving the mystery of who the **man** was because his name and probably his address would have been written on the ticket. The **man** was probably drugged when he was coming down to Lagos and abandoned in that bus," he said.
