18 burnt to death on Benin-Ore Expressway Friday, 21 Jan 2011 Share □ View All (27) Comment(s) Post Comment <u>Twitter</u> Send to friend At least 18 persons were on Thursday burnt to death along the Benin-Ore Expressway in a collision between an 18-seater bus heading from Lagos to the South-East and a truck. The accident was said to have occurred near Okada in Ovia North-East Local Government Area of Edo State when the truck veered off its course, while trying to avoid potholes, and rammed into the bus. The passenger vehicle immediately burst into flames. A witness told THE PUNCH that some people nearby rushed to the scene but could not rescue any of the passengers "as the bus was on fire with the occupants. There was no help in sight and there was nobody to help. There was nothing we could do."

A senior official of the Federal Road Safety Corps at the old Benin Toll-Gate confirmed the incident. When our correspondent contacted the FRSC's spokesman in the state, Mr. Olu Olumotomi, he said he was still expecting details of the accident.


