| Five killed, 12 injured as robbers raid bank in Ekiti

The peace of Ado-Ekiti, Ekiti State capital, was shattered on Tuesday as armed robbers raided a branch of First Bank of Nigeria Plc in the Okeyimi area of the town.

No fewer than four persons were shot dead while about 12 persons sustained various degrees of injuries in the operation that lasted for over an hour.

The robbers were also said to have killed a young man in <u>Ilupeju-Ekiti in Oy</u>e Local Government Area of the State while trying to escape.

Our correspondent gathered that the robbers who came in a convoy of vehicles, including a Sport Utility Vehicle, a white bus, a Hummer jeep and a car were said to have used dynamites to blow open the security door at the bank on arrival.

Our correspondent observed bullet marks on the walls of the bank and the adjoining building housing the office of Correspondents' Chapel of the Nigeria Union of Journalists in Okeyimi.

Sales representatives of various newspapers at the distribution point at Okeyinmi escaped unhurt as they hid under loads of unsold papers.

A V-Boot car belonging to the Chairman of the NUJ in the state, Mr. Tai Akogun, was riddled with bullets but Akogun was not in the car when the incident happened.

There were unconfirmed reports that two of the bank officials were injured in the attack.

It was also not confirmed at the time of this report if the robbers succeeded in stealing from the bank's vault.

Eyewitnesses at Okeyimi told journalists that policemen did not come to the scene on time despite distress calls made to them.

An eyewitness who identified himself as an ex-soldier, Mr. Olatunji Olaiya, said that he went to the police station in Okesa to inform the police. But that the policemen refused to come to the scene.

He said that he begged the DPO at the station to give him a rifle to go and confront the robbers but that the DPO declined.

But the Commissioner of Police in the state, Mr. Olayinka Balogun, told journalists that his men dislodged the robbers and pursued them to lkole-Ekiti.

He added that two of the robbers were shot "but we could not recovertheir corpses because they were inside their vehicle."

Balogun added that a vehicle brought by the gang was demobilised while a magazine with some rounds of ammunition dropped from the fleeing robbers as his men pursued them.

Also in Yenagoa, Bayelsa State, armed robbers operating on a motorcycle on Tuesday shot a middle aged woman and snatched a bag containing the money she withdrew from one of the commercial banks.

The hoodlums were said to have double-crossed their victims shortly after she left the bank situated along the popular Mbiama-Yenagoa Road in Yenagoa Local Government Area of the state.

A source who witnessed the incident told our correspondent that the woman was accosted by the gangsters as she was waiting to board a vehicle.
